RACES & EVENTS 2005-2006

At the end of July, Ely Runners became the 100th member of the **Association of GB Athletic Clubs (ABAC)** details of which can be found on their website www.britishathleticsclubs.com. Members are welcome to comment to secretary@elyrunners.co.uk on this new organisation. ABAC advised their members to vote 'No' to all four proposals in UKA's Foster Project Independent Poll and the Committee agreed to do so. Details were circulated to members by email on 1st October 2005.

Details of local races and those of interest to the club are on the regularly maintained **club notice board** in the foyer of the Paradise Centre below the club's **trophy cabinet** that was made by Charlie Barker. There are usually several copies of race entry forms but please always leave the last copy or ask the staff at reception to photocopy (Ely Runners' account) a few copies.

The last (of 8) races in the **2005 Cambridgeshire Road Race League (CRRL)** is the Fenland 10 Miles on Sunday 30th October at West Walton. It incorporates the County and EVAC Championships. Club standings are calculated on the best 7 results of 8 events and the individual standings on best 5 results from 8 events. There are awards for the 1st 3 men's teams, 1st 3 women's teams, 1st 3 individual men, and 1st 3 individual women. Results will be on www.nenevalleyharriers@fsnet.co.uk. The club has featured prominently in previous years. In both 2003 and 2004 Ely Runner's men's team were 3rd of 25 teams and Ely Runners' women improved from 17th in 2003, to 9th of 23 teams in 2004. In the individual men's event in 2004, Alex Tate was 1st, Maurice Reed 10th, and Alan Rutterford 12th. The first Ely Runners' woman in 2004 was Karen Foreman who was 26th. In 2003, Stephen Howard was 5th, Maurice Reed 9th and Alan Rutterford 10th in the Individual men's event. In 2000, 2001 and 2003, Diana Gipp was 1st woman overall, a hat trick for which she was presented with an Ely Runner's' Special Achievement Award at the 2003 AGM. In 2002, Diana was first woman in 5 of the 6 CRRL races in which she competed!

The **Frostbite League** will have six inter-club races of 5-6 miles (road/mixed terrain/XC) at one per month from October to March and these are on the list of events below. All races start at 11:00 am and a scoring team is 10 members of which at least 2 must be women but any number of members can run and all will contribute to the results by competing with potentially scoring runners of other clubs. The club's Team Recorder is Eric Drury (mob 07876 288496). The League's £100 membership fee for the 2005/06 season has been paid by the club so members run free of charge. Club colours must be worn whilst competing in the league. Yaxley Runners will host the Presentation Evening (venue below) on Friday 24th March 2006. Ely Runners' final positions since joining the FFL have been 2001/02 **9th**, 2002/03 **2nd**, 2003/04 **1st**, and 2004/05 **4th** of 17 teams. The <u>first race is at St Neots on Sunday 16th October</u> and it is important that we start well with a strong turnout. As C & C were unable to obtain Swavesey School on Sunday 11th December 2005, their Frostbite event has been put back to Sunday 18th December.

Several members have been entered for the spectacular **Beachy Head Marathon** on Saturday 29th October. There are two spare places available which we may be able to officially substitute for other members. Please contact John Turner ASAP if you would like to run or walk/jog the course. Due to injury, Alan Rutterford will walk/jog the course and invites any member/s who would like to use the two spare places to join him. This hilly South Downs run is almost entirely off-road across some of the most stunning scenery in the UK.

The **ECCA National Cross Country Relays** take place at Berry Hill Park, Mansfield on Saturday 12th November. Senior men run 4 x 5k and Senior Women 3 x 3k. If any members are interested, please contact John Turner. The club will pay for entries and these close on 24th October.

The club intends to enter 4-5 teams including, for the first time, *an all women's team* for the **Hereward Relay** on Sunday 27th November. This is a 38.4 miles four stage relay across the Fens by tracks, footpaths and rural roads from Peterborough Cathedral to Ely Cathedral. The stages are Peterborough to Whittlesey (6.1 miles), Whittlesey to March (11.6 miles), March to Welney (10.3 miles), and Welney to Ely (10.4 miles). Ely Runners will be responsible for marshalling from the Ely bypass to the finish on Palace Green. Second claim members may run. The presentation of awards will be in the upstairs bar in the Paradise Centre after the event. Please could members who would like to run (specify stage) contact the club's coordinator Alan Rutterford (01353 741534) if you would like to run or help. Details were circulated by email on 5th October 2005.

Following interest by members, the club has entered the **East Anglian Cross Country League (EACCL)**. The eleven venues are included in the events list below. Men's races are 5-6 miles women's about 4 miles. All the races are on <u>Wednesdays</u> at 2:30 pm and the venues include some interesting cross country course locations. Teams are 4 runners. The first 4 to finish will be the 'A' team and the next 4 the 'B' team. Categories are Jn M/W, Sn M/W and Vet M/W in 5 year categories to FV50+ and MV50 and then MV50-59 and MV60+. Accumulative team and individual scores will be taken from a maximum of 7 races. The club has paid the entry fee so members (and their guests) run free of charge. Guests will not count for League points.

As there is now Frostbite League race on Sunday 18th December, the **Ely Runners pre-Christmas training runs** from Woodditton/Reach to Ely have been changed to Sunday 11th December 2005..

Natalle Coles has taken over from Karen Foreman as Ely Runners' **Women's Team Leader** until Karen returns from Australia. Natalle will be organising women members for team and league events.

Torsten Lytken will not be seeking re-election as **Team Captain** at the AGM in January and proposals (ie yourself or someone else) for this Committee position should be forwarded to me. It is an important figurehead role, particularly for team organisation and election.

Club Coach Max d'Ayala has now obtained several **books on running and injuries** on behalf of the club. These books are kept in the club's locker at the Paradise Centre for use by members. There is a club book list on the web site. Loans are to be recorded in a notebook in the club's locker.

Alan Rutterford has been booked on a **Sport England First Aid Course** at Witchford Village College (6:00 pm - 10:00 pm in Room E7) on Tuesday 29th November 2005. The club will also pay the £12 fee for a limited number of other members to attend the course so that we have a reserve of sports first aid trained members, particularly for club open events. This course is open to all but especially recommended for coaches. It will provide a first aid certificate, handbook, and attendance certificate.

Sweatshop Cambridge have received the *London Marathon News* which includes the application form for the **2006 London Marathon**. It is also available in other sports shops and 2004 and 2005 runners will have received a copy by mail. *The closing date for entries is 21st October 2005*.

We have several **new members** and some are fairly new to running. It is important that inexperienced members are accompanied by more experienced members on training nights so they become familiar with routines and routes and are not left alone. Therefore, please could members who are recovering from injury, or resting from racing, or recovering fitness, please attend training to help our beginners.

Training on Tuesday and Thursday continues to be well attended with 15 to over 30 members regularly appearing. Due to the increased number of members meeting at the Paradise for training, members now assemble in the bar upstairs to avoid blocking the foyer. Now it is becoming dark in the evenings training will be mainly within Ely with interval/repetition/hill sessions on Tuesdays and steady (5-8 miles) runs on Thursdays. For those not racing on Sundays, meet in the Paradise car park at 9:00 am for a choice (short/medium/long) of mixed terrain training runs outside of Ely.

The club has purchased **reflective bibs** for members to wear whilst training at night. These have been available at the Paradise centre for use on training nights and have been issued to most members. More bibs are currently on order. Advice on training at night has been circulated recently and is on the web site www.elyrunners.co.uk

Many members have been supplied with **club fleeces** and more are on order. The fleeces are in black with a full length zip and have the Ely Runners cathedral logo embroidered in yellow on the top left front. A range of sizes is now available from stock and cost only £10 (subsidised by club) to members for their own use.
